

TECHNOLOGY

Technology is everywhere. Most of us carry a phone in our pocket that is more powerful than computers were ten years ago. Technology is truly remarkable—we can listen to new music, connect with far-away friends, and access any type of information. And most of us get lost a lot less thanks to our handy maps apps.

While technology can be extremely helpful, it also makes living a life with margin challenging. Our daily life is full of buzzes and rings that alert us to something that is noteworthy or requires our attention. In countless ways, our lives are easier because of technology, but are they better and more joyful? Are we fully present when we need to be, or are we living more distracted because of it?

In this final session, let's get very practical and talk about something that is all around us and fills up much of our day. Let's consider how to find margin in a technology-saturated world.

Philippians 3:14





Open your group with a brief prayer asking God for insight as you study. You can pray for specific requests at the end of the meeting, or stop momentarily to pray if a particular situation comes up during your discussion. Then begin your time together by using the following questions and activities to get people talking:

- What has surprised you most about this group?
 Where did God meet you over the past six weeks?

 How have you seen new technology change the way you relate, think, and live?
 Take some time for each person to share about how they've done with inviting the people on the Circles of Life to church or your small group. What specific conversations are you praying about for the weeks to come?

1 CORINTHIANS 9:24-27

Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize.


THINK ABOUT IT

- What is this race about?
- What is the prize that Paul is referring to?
- In your own words, what did Paul mean when he said, "No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize."?
- How might this passage relate to the way we approach technology?



STUDY NOTES

The race that Paul is talking about is about spreading the good news of Jesus Christ. We are not only invited to watch the game, but we are called to be part of it. This race is not just a race to prove right from wrong, but it is a race of life or death: "Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called when you made your good confession in the presence of many witnesses." (1 Timothy 6:12). Fight off the distractions that keep you from reaching the goal. Instead of being distracted by technology, use it to win the race and spread the gospel.





CREATE A NEW STORY


In this section, talk about how you will apply the wisdom you've learned from the teaching and Bible study. Then think about practical steps you can take in the coming week to live out what you've learned.

- Close by praying for your prayer requests and take a couple of minutes to review the praises you have recorded over the past six weeks on the Prayer and Praise Report on page 118.

ROMANS 10:14-15
