A current school physical may be included in place of a doctor's signature.

A Background Check is needed for participants 18 years of age and older.

We strongly encourage students to leave their phones and other electronics at home. Please no IPods, IPads, Portable DVD players, etc.

ABOUT LODGING

We have various lodging partners in Nashville. We will contact you when we finalize lodging details. Our campuses offer dining and meeting facilities that accommodate our



teams well. Participants will sleep in large rooms; boys and girls will be separated. Participants need to bring their own bedding: air mattresses, cots, pillows, etc. Free time can be spent in the gym and other designated areas around the school. Showers are available in the gym locker rooms. Breakfast and dinner will be served in the cafeteria. Lunch will be peanut butter and jelly sandwiches served at the worksite. Snacks may be available for purchase or you may bring your own snacks from home.

Expectations of High Standard:

We believe God has His hand on the mission trips and on the people who serve alongside us. Please respect the standards requested through this packet. You will receive our full support should participants have more conservative standards than the following:

- 1. Mission Discovery will not ban cellphones but we ask all participants limit their use of them. All electronics, including cellphones, can be distracting during the mission week.
- 2. Behavior, especially with the opposite sex, needs to be honoring to the Lord at all times.
- 3. Every participant is asked to cooperate with leadership. Please play your part in whatever is being done. Nothing will be asked of you that you cannot do.



- 4. No smoking, no alcoholic beverages, no drugs or weapons of any kind are allowed during the project week. Participants will be asked to return home if found with any of the these items.
- 5. Clothing must be modest and graphics should represent good character. No offensive wording or images allowed.

Dress Code:

Make modesty your priority. Clothing needs to be functional and comfortable. We suggest scrubs or other cotton pants. Due to various conditions on the worksite, appropriate clothing, being long pants or shorts, will be determined at the leaders meeting the day before. **Pack both!** Shorts must be a modest length. At the hotel you may wear modest shorts and modest tank tops. At the worksite shoulders must be covered. No sleeveless shirts away from camp.

Insurance:

Each person is responsible for their own medical insurance. Mission Discovery is not responsible for any sickness, injury or loss. Please respect the Mission Discovery Medical Information Form provided in your application packet. All participants should include the name and policy number of their insurance carrier. Please include a copy of the participant's medical insurance card.

How You'll Serve

You'll serve in Nashville doing projects such as these:

- Serving at adult day programs! Participants will participant in structured activities with senior citizens including chair exercises, social activities, memory exercises, and light games like Bingo. They are excited to meet you!
- Serving at a children's ministry camp! Participants will help children 1st-8th grade doing games, crafts, sports, bible time, reading, water games, and kick ball. Have fun creating relationships with the kids.
- Helping kids 1st-8th grade learn! Participants will serve at a Christian summer literacy program spending time with kids while doing bible enrichment, reading, math, and games.
- Learning about and fighting the devastating impact and perpetuation of poverty.
 Participants will serve at a global non-profit organization that collects shoes and clothes and redistributes these both directly to those in need as well as to qualified micro- enterprise programs. Participants will load and unload shoes, sort, and make shoe boxes
- Participants will be weeding, mulching, raking, cleaning, and branch trimming on a 10-acre retreat center of a local non-profit.
- Serving over 70 senior citizens at a affordable residential center. Ask to hear their story! They have cleaning projects and small maintenance jobs that they need. They would love help with computers and also enjoy exercise class.
- Working with adults that have disabilities at an art camp. Some will need a lot of help, while others will need encouragement and slight assistance.
- Gardening! This local garden is centered on growing food and growing people. It is
 a great place to get down and dirty while growing developing, feeding, and
 spiritually growing people in the local community. Participants will be planting,
 weeding, possibly harvesting, working in green houses, and cleaning up farm.

FUND RAISING

We encourage students to raise money on their own but the following 2 fund raisers are what we will do for the students attending this mission trip.

T-Shirts- We will be selling T-Shirts this Spring to help raise money for the students going on the Mission Trip. All proceeds from the sale will be split evenly among the students that **participate** in the sale of the T-Shirts.

<u>Fund Raising Letters</u>- We also give a template letter for students to send out to family, friends, neighbors, etc. to raise money for their trip. (See template letter below)
