Jonah' s Theology is unexceptional, but like so much theology, it seems to make no difference to his actions.

We are certainly intended to perceive the incongruity between the prophet's confession of God as creator of the sea and his attempt to escape on it.

# **Perry Brown**

"Jonah' s fear is a feeble thing, for all its orthodoxy... the runaway prophet is shown in a bad light: crew and captain can teach him many a lesson about his own faith."

# Jonah 2:10 "vomited" -- Lev 18:24-30; 20:22

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Perhaps it is an editorial comment by God concerning Jonah's confession (1:9), promises and vows (2:9)...and the sincerity of the prayer.

## James Watts Song of the Ancient Reader

"The prayer ignores the essential issue between the prophet and God: Jonah's refusal of a prophetic commission."

A Life that is Growing Spiritually confesses sin...not pious words of religiosity.

### Jonah 3:1-3

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time:

"Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I gave you. Jonah obeyed the word of the Lord..."

### **Edwin Good**

"In the author's mind, Nineveh is not a quantity but a quality, not a mere metropolis but an immorality. He takes the symbol of the ancient world's most impressive evil, magnifies and intensifies it by mass, and sends his timorous prophet into the middle of it."





(Jonah 3:4) Nineveh will be <u>overturned</u>

## Hapak

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(Exodus 7:15) Moses' staff <u>changed</u> to a snake (Exodus 7:17, 20) Water of the Nile <u>changed</u> into blood (Hosea 11:8) Lord's Heart is <u>changed</u>



#### Hebrew Verb *qum* = ARISE

LORD tells Jonah to arise and go to Nineveh (1:2) The captain implores Jonah to arise (NIV = "get up" - 1:6)The Lord tells Jonah to arise and go to Nineveh a second time (3:2) Jonah "Arises" and goes to Nineveh (NIV = "Went to Nineveh" - 3:3) The King of Nineveh rose from his throne (3:6)

### 1) Rises from throne (seriousness)

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1) Rises from throne (seriousness) 2) Took of royal robes (submission) 3) Covers w/sackcloth (repentance) 4) Sits in dust (hopelessness)

A Life that is Growing Spiritually responds to God in humility...not in arrogance and pride.

### Satire

The attempt to effect reform by ridicule of an idea, a person or type of person; makes frequent use of irony.

"I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity."

## Jonah Feared that the LORD just might be the LORD.

## He feared that God might be God (not himself)

#### Exodus 34:6

"And he passed in front of Moses proclaiming, "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness..."

#### **Growth Indicator #11**

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A Life that is Growing Spiritually evaluates one's heart and removes that which hinders service or perspective
